The largest airplane in the world landed at Toronto Pearson airport this past week. The AN-225 Mrija (Dream) is a Russian built cargo aircraft which was adapted to carry the Buran, the Russian version of the Space Shuttle. The AN-225 has a max weight of 640 tons at take-off. Only 1 version was completed with another partially completed.
